HOW TO ENTER

ONE exhibit per Exhibitor is allowed for each class. Except for the Spring Gardening Fayre where we are allowing a maximum of 2 entries per member

- To ensure your entry is included, please send a complete list of all your exhibits to the Exhibits Secretary by 8:00 pm on the Thursday before the Fayre. You can email exhibitsfgc@gmail.com or call 07415 050 183. Late entries may be accepted on the day between 09:00 and 09:45 am if space allows. Please note that no late entries will be accepted after 09:45 am, as judging preparation begins promptly at 10:00 am. If you have any questions about your entry, please feel free to contact the Exhibits Secretary—whose decision on entries will be final.
- Include your name, Membership number (if applicable), and contact details at the top of your email. List the Class numbers you want to enter in numerical order. Each Exhibitor may submit one exhibit per class, except at the Spring Fayre. Non-members can enter their first exhibits but must become members to enter future Fayres.
- Please remember to arrive with your entries at Hempton Memorial Hall on Saturday morning, between 09.00 and 09.45 am. After you have handed in your exhibits, all entrants are required to leave the Hall while judging is in progress. The judge's decision is final. Once judging is complete, entrants may return to Hempton Memorial Hall at 11.00 am to view the results and collect their entries; please do not enter the hall before this time.

If you are joining us for the first time, friendly volunteers will be available at the entrance to assist you with your entries and answer any questions.

NOTES ON ENTRIES

- All exhibits in every class must be grown or produced by the entrant.
- Vegetable exhibits must be cleaned and stripped of unnecessary leaves and stalks, unless otherwise stated in the schedule.
- All pot plants must have been in the exhibitor's care for at least three months.
- Exhibitors are encouraged to name varieties; however, errors in naming will not disqualify an entry.

Definitions:

- **Bowl:** A hollow, rounded, cup-shaped container.
- **Vase:** A vessel with a greater height than width.

The Fayre will be open to the public from 11.00 am, there will be informal workshops and demonstrations on a variety of topics. Refreshments and the 'On the Spot' Tombola will be available from 11.00 to 2.00 pm.
